Did You Know?

- 🌐 **Plastic bags and Styrofoam are NOT accepted in the City's Blue Bins!**
- 🌐 You can recycle pizza boxes as long as they don't have grease stains or food residue spots bigger than the palm of your hand.
- 🌐 You can recycle your lids (for plastic, glass and metal) simply by reattaching them to the empty bottle, jar or container.
- 🌐 Clean aluminum foil is recyclable.

Why Recycle?

- 🌐 Recycling helps keep alleys clean, which reduces crime, deters illegal dumping and improves public health.
- 🌐 Recycling created 681,000 jobs, \$37.8 billion in wages and \$5.5 billion in tax revenue in the U.S. in 2020.
- 🌐 Recycling protects and conserves Earth's limited natural resources and habitats.
